Board of Managers

It has become more and more apparent that Lance does a lot more at St Margaret's than just to be the treasurer. We are still thinking and praying for Lance as he struggles with significant health issues. We continue to thank you for your patience with regard to reporting on the church finances. Lance has made much progress with them over last few weeks, so we will continue to support him as he catches up with them.

I reported last month that we had significant work needing to be done on our sewerage system. Board of manager finally approved a quote for just under \$5000 to undertake the repairs. Sadly, these repairs will not be able to be done before the fair. We will plan and manage the situation for the fair.

At a meeting of the Church council a few months ago we made the decision that the kitchen was desperately in need of an upgrade and so the process has begun. A subcommittee was set up from Board of Managers and the committee met and got feedback from the regular users of the Kitchen regarding anything they feel needs to be addressed in the upgrade. We have collated the feedback and had a kitchen designer and builder in to measure and give us some proposed designs. We are now waiting for those designs which the Church Council will then look at and seek quotes for. We are hoping that we can present a proposed design to the congregation, with a quote as to the cost, at the AGM in November.

The work continues in keeping St Margaret's well maintained and looking good. A very big 'Thank You' to the team on the Board of Managers for their hard work.
