From the Board of Managers

Once again, I sit writing this article with my thoughts and prayer going out to Lance and Pam as Lance continues to struggle with Long-Covid. I am hoping that we will be able to report the financial position of St Margaret's in our next newsletter.

In the meantime, things continue to happen at the church. The tree that was half trimmed when I wrote the September newsletter article, has been full trimmed. The sewer issue has just deepened, and we are staring down a significant bill to repair our troubled sewerage system. At the time of writing this article we are still awaiting a second and third quote. Our hope remains that we can get the work completed before the church Fair in November.

You may have noticed that there are three very large water tanks sitting outside the lounge door at the back of the building. These are a part of St Margaret's plan to be ready to serve our community in the event of a disaster. A Staff member from WREMO (Wellington Regional Emergency Management Office) will be meeting with our church council in November to help us draw up a Disaster Management Plan and then from there will also lead a workshop early next year for all our members and members of the community, to help us be better prepared at home in the event of a disaster. With our buildings strengthened to over 80% of code we are well situated to be a resource for our community in a disaster. We can only do this if we are prepared. The finance needed to do these preparations, like the purchase of the tanks, was raised through an application for funding from the Heretaunga Bookfest trust. We are deeply grateful for the approval of our application for funding. Further details and information will be given in the near future.

Once again, a very big 'Thank You' to all the members of the Board of Managers for the hard work they put into making St Margaret's look so good.

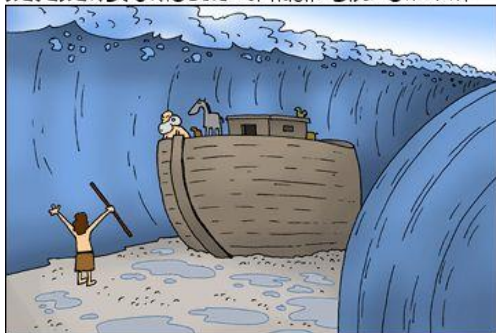

Save the date: Christmas lunch – 4 December – at Rustic Kitchen. All are welcome.

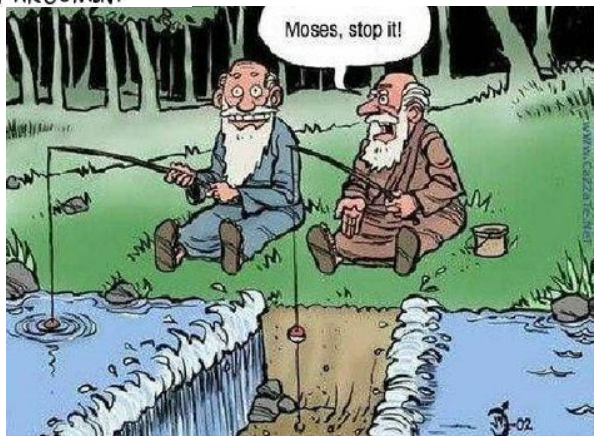
