The second is to be open to change, but to let it happen without any conscious thought and planning. When we face change in this way, we often leave a trail of hurt and fear in our wake.

The proper way to face change is to look at the past, evaluate the present and consciously plan for the future.

Why do I say this? I look around me and I see a fair amount of change that has happened at St Margaret's and some changes that are in the planning.

For me change is exciting. It is a sign of life within a congregation. A parish is spiritually alive when people are dreaming about how things change and what opportunities we might grab onto to serve our community.

The physical changes are glaringly obvious with the oak tree gone, but there is exciting stuff happening in the ministry side of the church. Though it is not new, it is still very exciting that 'Playgroup' has been resurrected.

What an amazing job Adena, Ainsley and Mara are doing! The manner in which the church council has

embraced my hair brain scheme to be prepared to serve our community in the event of a disaster, is very exciting to me. We are about to put in our second and final

application for funding for equipment we need and will have just had our workshop on helping people traumatised by a disaster as this newsletter goes to print.

We are about to trial an addition to the police referrals which will include referrals from Wellington Free Ambulance visits. It warms my heart to see our people working so hard to put smiles on peoples faces.

St Margaret's is alive and well and this is all thanks to you, the members. Your faith and life continue to ensure that we are a shining light in our community. God bless us all as we prepare to launch into the second half of 2025.

Even the weather was in our favour on the day.

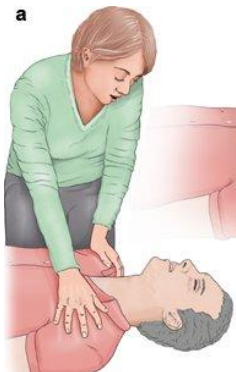
The total amount raised will be around \$5,200 which is incredible – thank you all !
