

A dozen of us make up the St Margaret's Te Hāhi team. Our bakers have twice dropped off lovely, greatly appreciated goodies to the UH Police.

The whānau support team are on call one week in four to take referrals from the police family harm team. Episodes the police have been called to which are not serious enough for further action from them, are referred to us, when the people accept the offer of contact from a Te Hāhi volunteer. During our three on-call weeks we've had 13 referrals with 22 people to contact. Ages have ranged from 19 to 76 involving siblings, parent/offspring and partners.

In pairs we make contact via text and call, to offer support and a listening ear. A longer phone call or visit may follow. After several attempts, there are some we are unable to reach. We leave a voice message and text, so they know there are volunteers in the community who care and whom they can contact when they feel able.
