## Oak Tree at St Margaret's

At last year's AGM a proposal was brought by Board of Managers to fell the oak tree in the front of the church. After discussion it was taken to a vote and the decision to remove the oak tree was unanimous.

Why remove the oak tree?

There are 3 reasons why this has become necessary. The first is that the tree has got to the height where it is needing to be trimmed every 2 years to make sure it is clear of the power lines. This trimming costs us in the region of \$3500 each time. Board of Managers felt that it was not good stewardship spending this amount of church money on trimming a tree. The second reason came to light when we found wood rot around the windows in the front of the church. This partly due to the church not getting enough sunlight. The third reason has to do with oak tree roots found in the sewer pipes when we replaced them. Though they were not the main reason for the sewer blockage problem we were having, it was certainly a contributing factor and would only get worse in the future.

This decision was not taken lightly and we will be replacing it with a more suitable NZ species. If you have any preferences or suggestions as to what type of tree might be better suited in the front of the church, please let me know.
