**MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING**  
**held following the morning worship service on Sunday 15 June 2025**

**PRESENT:** Rev Rodney Ramsay (Moderator), and 59 members of the congregation.

**OPENING:** Rodney explained that this special meeting was to update the congregation on the work to upgrade the kitchen as undertaken at the AGM in 2024 and to seek approval to carry out the proposed improvements. He opened the meeting with prayer.

Chris Upton was then invited to take the congregation through a presentation describing the action taken since the last congregational AGM in 2024.

The meeting was then opened for discussion and the answering of questions. During the discussion comment was made that the piles under part of the kitchen floor needed strengthening and that this work was included within the quotes obtained. Also during the discussion was the pledge of \$615.00 toward the cost from the Afternoon Fellowship.


At the conclusion of the discussion, it was then moved by Chris Upton seconded by Alred Enslin:

The motion was put to the meeting and passed unanimously.


Meeting ended at 11:20 am with the sharing in the Benediction.

## **Conducted interviews and surveys with approx. 10 power users!!**

### **Main Findings:**

- Happy with overall layout
- Cabinets, cupboards, paint etc are very tired.
- Need to declutter unused items and better utilise space.
- Move Pie Warmer (not frequently used outside of fair)
- Stainless Steel island is great, open shelves in this area work well (no need to replace this area)
- Prefer for a continuous stainless bench top on the lounge (to match existing island)
- Rework storage of mugs, utensils, plates, waste/recycling etc.
- Retain two sinks (make one (by coffee) twin)
- Keep servery hatch to Hall and Lounge
- Appliances work well - no need to replace.

### **From the Board of Managers**

As mentioned in the main article, the kitchen upgrade has been launched and work on site should start in around 5 to 6 weeks. This will cause some inconvenience for any activity in the church that uses the kitchen. The important activity is the hallowed cup of tea after church. Everything will be done to make sure we can still fellowship together on Sundays.

We have come to the end of our church financial year, which ended on 30 June. We are very aware that we have not been able to report the financial progress through the year as we have walked the journey of Lance's illness and the handover to our new treasurer, Sarah Smith. We are working at getting our monthly financial report into the monthly newsletter in the very near future.
