Greetings

The theme that has come out of our recent church services has been around what it means to be the church. We are called to be a community that loves and supports each other in the church, a community that grows together in our love and knowledge of God and a church that serves our wider Silverstream community. We not only grow together, but we also laugh and cry together. As a community we still feel very deeply the loss of Archer and the pain and grief that Tamara, Paul, Billy, Poppy and the wider Betteridge and Noyes family are going through. Please keep them in your thoughts and prayers.



I would like to say a few words about one of the service programs we have in the church, that of Te Hahi. If you are not aware, Te Hahi is a national organisation that was set up to support families where there has been conflict in the family and the police were involved. Te Hahi gets referrals from the police to follow up with families in situations that are low risk. We make contact with the families and visit them if they would like us to. We also support with food and other practical needs. Oh, and we bless the police by dropping off baking for them. There are 4 churches in Upper Hutt that are involved in this ministry, St Margaret's being one of them. Our team of visitors are trained and now, we can say with some confidence, gaining experience.

Why am I talking about Te Hahi again? Well, two reasons. First is that Te Hahi has now formalised an agreement with Wellington Free Ambulance and when their paramedics do a home call, they will be handing people a card with Te Hahi contact number on it so that they can call us if they feel that they need a visit. If you would like to be a part of this ministry, please email or give me a call and we can slot you into the next training session. The second reason I raise Te Hahi is that I will be taking over as the 'Regional Champion' for Upper Hutt when Mile Davison, the pastor of Heretaunga Community Church, steps down.

The other exciting news is that, as you may know, with our centenary being 5 years away, we have undertaken to produce a book on the history of St Margaret's. This mammoth task will be led by Andrew Coleman who has kindly volunteered his time and expertise. This work is now underway.

I am humbled by the level of engagement and passion for the life and ministry at St Margaret's. I want to thank everyone for their contribution in making this a very special place of worship and ministry.
